
Homework


- First year students receive homework in the all subjects.

PREPARING FOR THE MOVE


- Affirm open lines of communication.

- Scoil Chonglais is an inclusive school and our aim is to enable all students to reach their potential.
- Following enrolment, members of the Additional Educational Needs (AEN) department liaise with primary schools and parents to establish the learning needs of incoming students.
- Standardised tests are carried out to examine what the needs of each student are as the assessments assist in identifying students who may require additional support.
- In consultation with parents and students, members of the AEN department carefully plan and co-ordinate student support.
- A team of dedicated and caring special needs assistants (SNA's) provide support to students with additional care needs.



AEN Supports

Students with additional needs may receive support within the classroom, through team teaching, in small groups, or in one-to-one tuition based on students' individual needs.

Interventions draw on evidence-informed practice, and the professional knowledge and experience of teachers; they reflect the priority learning needs of students, as well as building on their strengths and interests.

Students who have been granted an Irish exemption, based on language or learning needs, will receive support at times where Irish classes are normally scheduled.



Book Scheme

- No cost for Books or Stationery Free Books Scheme
- Books will be owned by the school and loaned to students and returned after the end of Junior Cycle.
- School books/ebooks, workbooks, novels, plays and exam papers.
- Some (not all) Core Classroom resources covered.





School Devices

- One important support that your child will benefit from at Scoil Chonglais is the 1:1 device that they will use to learn about new topics, to study, to revise, and to prepare projects.
- The decision to use 1:1 devices in Scoil Chonglais was taken in order support learning while decreasing phone use.
- Students regularly needs to consult different apps including MS
 Teams for notes and exam assistance, and for day-to-day class tasks.
- Students no longer need to use a phone to complete project work, and this means that they are spending more time away from social media with its distractions and pressures.
- The laptop gives the students access to a long list of supports and resources, to aid their learning. This list includes audio visual materials, revision tasks, quizzes, ready-made notes on PowerPoint, as well as mock and past exam materials, and sample exam answers.
- The 1:1 device serves to help your child, and it will give your child every advantage in preparing for exams at all levels.
